







## 45 % of the respondents employed less than 5 personnel














## **62.7** % of the respondents leased office space





### Please indicate industry sector:






### **Top 5 Industry Sectors:**

### Which best describes your position:








### 69.4 % of the respondents Owned the small business




37.3 % of the respondents reported that profits decreased in 2011 37.3 % of the respondents reported that profits increased in 2011





### In 2012, I predict my profits to








## **62.7** % of the respondents reported that they expect profits to **increase** in 2012




## **64.7** % of the respondents plan to maintain operations in 2012





### The top three challenges facing my small business are:







### The three top advocacy matters that I want the Chamber to address for small businesses are:



- Energy costs, Business advice and Debt Collection
- •Unlicensed Business Competition, Energy Bills & Business Overhead Costs
- •Reduction on work permit fees, more options for funding/financial assistance, more encouragement or incentives for Caymanians to get involved and owning businesses
- •Helping small businesses reach target markets at an affordable price
- •Professional Training for Young Caymanians, Duty Concessions for small businesses, Immigration matters as they relate to permits

- •Upholding the code of ethics of the better business council to all members

### The three top advocacy matters that I want the Chamber to address for small businesses are:



- •We have a lot of huge contracts that never pay us on time, it would be great to have a small business bank that can exchange job orders for actual cash ;-)
- •General cost of doing business, Government Planning fees and slowness of turnaround time for plans, Health insurance for companies- there are no proper regulations in place, and the governing agency can't do anything to support businesses
- •Streamline work permit procedures, Produce a reliable, accurate, data base of persons seeking employment and verify their qualifications, Work to stamp out corruption at all levels of Government.
